Just browsing in the bookstores here is a treat unto itself.

Daunt Books: You won't feel daunted at Daunt. **33.**_____ you going on a trip and want to read a novel or nonfiction book set in the place you're headed? This Marylebone High Street bookshop arranges books by country, so it's easy to find anything by place. The space itself is worth **34.**_____: high ceilings and tall windows add to the intellectual ambiance.

Foyles Books: Dig, if you will, the picture: four miles of shelves holding up to 200,000 books. Let's hope you **35.**_____ some time to browse when popping into Foyles.
