Let's go to New Zealand!

Have you ever thought about a trip to New Zealand? You'll probably never want to leave this little country if you love breath-taking landscapes, extreme outdoor sports and adventures that test your courage. **34.** ____ At approximately 268,000 square kilometres in size, New Zealand is about half the size of Spain. Approximately 4.9 million people live there, whereas the population of Spain is almost ten times greater.

One thing that you can't avoid about travelling to New Zealand is just how long it takes to get there from many places. Whether you're flying from the USA or Europe, you will need to take at least one extremely long flight. One of the longest flights in the world is the 17-hour non-stop flight from Dubai to Auckland, the largest city in New Zealand. **35.** ____ This, combined with an 11-hour time difference from Europe, means that at six o'clock in the evening your body thinks that it's time for breakfast. But the long trip is truly worth it.

36. ____ One minute you are looking at snow-capped mountains and then, within a few hours you can be on a remote beach completely isolated from the world. Queenstown is one of the most famous ski resorts in the world, and because the seasons are 'upside down' in the Southern Hemisphere, Olympic ski champions go to New Zealand to train when it is summer in the Northern Hemisphere.

It's impossible to think of New Zealand without thinking of the films *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings*. Tourists travel the globe just to see the beautiful forests and mountains that provided over 200 locations for these movies. As the first European settlers only arrived in New Zealand a few hundred years ago, you won't come across any medieval castles like those in the films. The people who had been living in New Zealand before that time were Māori, the

original inhabitants. Although English is the official language, thousands of place names are Māori and it's the second language of New Zealand.

Volcanoes have been erupting in this region of the world for millions of years. **37.** ____ When you see this in the beautiful green forests it's as though you're in another world. Unfortunately, New Zealand is in an earthquake zone and, although scientists monitor seismic activity, it is impossible to predict exactly when an earthquake will occur. But that shouldn't stop you planning a trip you'll never forget.
