Percy Jackson

Percy Jackson is one of the most loved teenage heroes in modern books. He first appeared in *Percy Jackson & The Olympians: The Lightning Thief*, written by Rick Riordan in 2005. Since then, Percy has become a favourite character for many young readers around the world. But why do teenagers like him so much?

One reason is that Percy is easy to relate to. He is not perfect. He has dyslexia (a reading disorder), ADHD (attention problems), and trouble at school. Many teenagers face the same issues. In the story, these problems are signs that he is special—a demigod, the son of a Greek god. This idea helps readers feel that their own struggles might mean they are strong in other ways.

Another reason Percy is popular is because the books are full of adventure. Rick Riordan mixes Greek mythology with the modern world. For example, Mount Olympus is on top of the Empire State Building in New York, and the Underworld is under Los Angeles. Ancient gods and monsters appear in today's cities. This makes learning about myths fun and exciting.

Percy also uses a lot of humour. He tells jokes and makes funny comments, even when he is in danger. Each chapter has a funny title, and Percy often laughs at himself. This style makes the books fun to read and helps readers feel close to Percy. Teenagers like that Percy talks like they do and has the same feelings they have.

Another important part of Percy's story is friendship. Percy is not a hero alone. He has friends like Annabeth, Grover, and others who help him. They work as a team, support each other, and grow together. This shows that being a hero is not just about being strong—it's also about caring for others.

The books also include many different types of characters. There are people from many cultures, with different abilities and ways of thinking. Some characters are gay, some are from different ethnic backgrounds, and some have disabilities. This helps many readers feel that they are seen and understood.

Rick Riordan did not stop with the first Percy Jackson series. He wrote more books, like *The Heroes of Olympus* and *The Trials of Apollo*, which continue the story and introduce new heroes. A new TV series on Disney+ is also bringing Percy's story to new fans.

In a world full of superheroes who seem perfect, Percy Jackson is different. He is brave but makes mistakes. He is powerful but still learning. He is funny, kind, and always tries to do what is right. That's why teenagers still love him. Percy shows that even if you feel different, you can still be a hero.
