Część II (0-10)**TEXT 1: Read the text and choose the best answer. (0-5)****'I watched my stolen phone head to London, Dubai and China'**

Phone theft can unfold in an instant — a passing bike, a brief distraction — and a person's entire digital life can vanish. This moment of shock is experienced hundreds of times a day across the UK, and its consequences are often deeply emotional as well as financial.

Fenella Rawling learned this during a shopping trip in Cambridge, when her new iPhone 16 was snatched from her hands. The device contained irreplaceable photos of her mother, who has incurable lung cancer.

With no backup or iCloud account set up, the images are now permanently lost. Through the Find My app, she watched the phone move from London to Dubai and eventually China, followed by a series of phishing attempts aimed at accessing her account.

Incidents like hers are becoming increasingly common as organised crime groups target phones that can sell for up to £400. One offender managed to steal 24 devices in a single hour. London taxi drivers report that visitors are cancelling trips because they no longer feel the city is safe. According to the Met Police, 117,211 phones were stolen in 2024 — a 25% rise compared with 2019. Thieves typically rely on fast electric motorbikes, prompting police to deploy their own high powered bikes to pursue them.

The response also extends to the air. The National Police Air Service uses helicopters equipped with advanced cameras capable of tracking suspects from a distance, and officers say their presence alone often discourages offenders from continuing.

Civilians have begun to play a role as well. Delivery driver Diego Galdino films pickpockets and warns potential victims, gaining millions of views online. He notes that thieves usually operate in coordinated groups, conceal their identities, and quickly pass stolen items to avoid detection.

British Transport Police report that some offenders commute into London daily "to carry out a day's work," including individuals travelling from cities such as Portsmouth. Others fly into the UK for short periods specifically to steal. Officers estimate that around 600 local individuals are part of a wider network operating in hotspots like Finsbury Park.
